Dear Parents:

**Welcome Back!** The school year is off to a wonderful start. The students have been fantastic! I am very proud of them and you can be too. The staff and I are very excited to be working with your children. I can promise you that we will do our best to see that your son/daughter is successful and that we meet their educational needs.

**The mission statement for our building is to have students that want to Learn, are Respectful and Show Compassion.”** As you enter the building by the office, you can view the mission statement for the entire building, as well as the mission statement for the district. You will also see throughout the building our Matrix for the **PBIS** (Positive Behavior, Intervention, and Supports) program that has been implemented throughout the district. The district chose the slogan **C.A.R.E.** (Cooperation, Accountability, Respect and Effort). As part of this matrix, the staff developed expected procedures for the classroom, hallway/locker, cafeteria, restroom and recess for students to follow. I have attached a copy of that matrix for you in this newsletter. The goal of the program is to model and recognize good behavior. Students are given purple and silver slips for good behavior and red for inappropriate behavior. Since August, we have had only 10 red slips and 234 purple/silver sheets.

The district statement is “**The Claymont Community.... Preparing Every Child for a Lifetime of Success.**” We at CIS want to foster a love for learning, while instilling the characteristics of being good citizens, which is incorporated throughout our C.A.R.E. program. Our hope is that you as parents and community members will join us in reaching our mission. By working together, this will make a greater impact on our/your children’s lives.

**On-line forms** must be completed in order for your son or daughter to attend any after-school activity (Art Club, Choir, Modeling & Design, Big Brothers, or tutoring). All of these activities will begin this week. If you need help with this, please stop in the office.

The Home & School Association has agreed to provide the students with good behavior field trips and rewards. Any new suggestions or ideas for the trips and rewards would be deeply appreciated. Our first 9 weeks celebration trip will be to ALPA Lanes for bowling on Nov. 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>. (**If on-line forms have been completed**)

Please note with the new highly qualified law, I am very proud to say that **all** the teachers at CIS are highly qualified according to state standards and that we are a school-wide facility under the **Federal Title I program**.

**Open House** was held August 23<sup>rd</sup> and was a Great Success! We had approximately 90% of our students’ parents and grandparents show up.

If you are considering doing such a thing, we ask that you make a donation to the Home & School Association and that money will be used to buy books for the library. A special sticker will be placed in the book as to who purchased it and whom it is in memory of. You will be notified as to what was purchased with your donation.

**Box Tops-**CIS will once again be collecting Box Tops for building rewards. Prizes will be awarded monthly for the students who bring in the most.

**Progress Book**-As we begin our tenth year of progress book, I wanted to emphasize to you that this is a great way for you to keep track of your son/daughter's progress. The program is designed to inform you about not only your child's grades, but also missing assignments and homework. Please remember that after the first grading period, you may not have access to this program if you have not paid your child's school fees. School fees are **\$25.00 fourth grade and \$55.00 for fifth grade**. The difference in price is due to the fact that each fifth grader has his/her own chrome book to use. Partial payments can be made! Please make checks payable to Claymont City Schools. **This year all mid-terms and report cards will be on-line!**

**Free Lunch/Free Breakfast** will be offered to every student this year. Even if they are late, we can give them a breakfast bag to go. I strongly encourage you to take advantage of this program.
